Addington Render project – summer 2021 update

This summer Wokingham Borough Council will begin its project to replace the external render on the main building at Addington School in Woodley.

Work will be taking place on site during the summer school holidays to replace parts of the exterior render.

There will be some non-noisy and non-disruptive work during term times in the spring and summer months, over the next few years.

Background

The render is the prominent exterior on the outside of the main building. There have been ongoing problems with the external render since the building was finished in 2009. These had been repaired on an ongoing basis but the council enforced a latent defect clause in line with the contract conditions.

The original contractor has agreed to carry out the repairs, which will have no financial cost to the school, council or taxpayer. The school, council and contractor have been working together to ensure this takes place promptly without disrupting the school or its activities.

What will happen?

Work will be taking place on different parts of the school building in different stages. This is starting with the west elevation and roof lights in summer 2021.

All noisy work, such as drilling and hammering, will take place outside of term time. If it is undertaken during term time will take place outside of pupil hours.

Any work which does take place with students on site will be less noisy work, such as the installation of the render.

How will we be kept updated?

Further updates will be sent ahead of each stage of works over the next few years.




Please remember that money for school dinners should be paid **in advance**.

Daisy Class



This term we have continued our theme of 'Transport', our favourite story this term was 'Whatever Next?'. Through our sensory story we explored textures and senses. We had lots of giggles from some students when we travelled over the bubble wrap moon. We have continued to explore our senses through TAC PAC and sensology and are now showing more exploration of materials than before and tolerating more textures. We have taken advantage of the lovely weather with some of the activities from the story 'Mr Gumpy's Outing'. We made boats from different materials, had lots of fun with water play, sailed boats down guttering and explored animals and objects that float and sink. We ended the term with a trip to the wheelchair accessible park to explore and have a picnic lunch, like in our story.

This term some pupils have enjoyed Waldon activities and pre-sensory circuits. We have worked on tracking of lights and interacting with new toys and switch operated toys. Bubbles and parachute has been a huge hit and supported their language development by pupils requesting more of the motivating activity using a communication switch or showing anticipation and saying "Go!" We have also continued to enjoy our swimming, rebound, sand and soft play sessions. Jo and I are moving to new classes in September and will miss working in Daisy Class. Sunflower Class

We made 'ants on logs' and lemonade during our cooking sessions.





We loved taking part in Sean's music sessions each week and we all had a go at playing the cello!

We are saying good bye to some of our friends who are moving up a Key Stage! We wish them all good luck on their next adventure!


Lily Class



Have a lovely summer break and we will see you in September!




Poppy Class

Beech Class



Key Stage 4


Kite Class




Sixth Form News



6th form upcycling project




6th form students have enjoyed off site activities as the restrictions have gradually eased.
