
CAR PARKING REMINDER




Early Years

This term we have enjoyed exploring our new topic of 'Growing', especially listening to the story of the Very Hungry Caterpillar, and exploring different foods from the story during our food play sessions. We have also enjoyed watching our real-life caterpillars go into their chrysalis and turn into beautiful butterflies before we set them free! We have explored paint using a range of tools such as paintbrushes and potatoes, as well as our hands and feet during Art sessions this termwe celebrated Holi the festival of colour by painting with lots of different colours! It was lovely to have some nice sunny weather this term, and we enjoyed lots of outdoor learning, including some water play which we loved! We're looking forward to lots of fun Easter activities in our last week of term, including having our own Easter Egg hunt!













Daffodil Class

This term in Daffodil class they have enjoyed the topic of Growing this term. They have explored the story of 'Jack & the Bean Stalk' and 'The Enormous Tulip' making a story map to help them to react the story using props. We have been busy planting seeds and learning about parts of a plant and how to look after our own plants. The highlight of the term was having our own caterpillars and seeing them develop into butterflies and learning first-hand about the lifecycle of the butterfly. We have worked hard on our maths skills this term holding numbers in our mathematical brain and counting on using Numicon number shapes to complete addition sums. We have also explored shapes.

Lily Class have really enjoyed the 'Spring and Growing' topic this term! Here is a display of some of the amazing work we have created together! We have really enjoyed sharing the following stories and using them as inspiration for our learning: 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar', 'Six Little Chicks' and 'We're Going on an Egg Hunt'.



We have learnt all about the lifecycles of butterflies, chickens and frogs! We have even had 5 caterpillars in class and we were so excited to see the first one transform into a beautiful butterfly this week! We can't wait to meet the other 4 when they emerge from their cocoons.



Primrose Class

This term in Primrose class we have been learning about growing, plants and animals. We have been exploring with different materials in our sensory art sessions, such as stamping with spring onions to create our Mother's Day cards and stamping with sponges to create our St Patrick's Day art, as well as adding feathers to chick outlines and using daffodils to create some beautiful pictures.





We have also been exploring curiosity boxes with numbers, different

materials, musical instruments and different stuffed animals.

Outside, we have enjoyed mark making, examining numbers to 10 and water play! We have also loved playing the musical instruments along to nursery rhymes such as 'Old MacDonald' and '5 sleeping bunnies'.







We have been really busy and have had so much fun!







Tulip Class

This half term, Tulip class have been very busy learning all about our topic 'Growing Plants and Animals'. We have thoroughly enjoyed activities based on the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. Some activities the pupils have engaged well in, include; shared writing (painting the story using media), food play and retelling the story using sensory experiences and props and bucket themed caterpillar or butterfly activities.





This half term, we also went on our first school trip to Thames Valley Adventure Playground. The pupils had a fantastic time exploring this facility. Lots of the children particularly liked exploring the outdoor spaces, such as the electric train and the sand pit. The zip wire swing was another favourite for quite a few of the pupils.

Our lemon scented and elderflower scented play dough smelt lovely to explore during our dough disco session on Pancake Day.









Our new **balance boards** in yoga have been explored imaginatively by the children and staff in our sessions....lots of fun plus having to work hard on balance and team work.

We have explored the lifecycle of a butterfly □ through yoga and from this term's story **The Very**Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle has been interesting and we created a beautiful flow starting our bodies in egg pose (Crystal/child's asana) then moving into caterpillar □ pose (cat asana), then into a cocoon (cow asana) and finally moving our body as a beautiful fluttering butterfly. The coloured ribbons really helped our bodies move to the music and lots of creative shapes were made. Spending time watching our class caterpillars mindfully has very calming for the body and mind as well.









We have been enjoying our outside music box of instruments every Thursday lunchtime with Claire. Lots of creative rhythms have been created and the children have enjoyed making their independent song requests

using the singing puppet bag and requesting songs from the symbol communication boards too.



Miss Nina has been fun to sing and play instruments along too as she sings the whole story including all the Saturday treat foods to the tune of Alice the Camel on her red rguitar. Here is the **You Tube** to play along to at home.








Exploring coloured sand during our creative mindful moments was very relaxing to create a sand mandala.

Willow Class

Willow Class have found this half term's topic "Amazing Eggs" "eggstremely" motivating . We have explored new life and signs of spring through stories, art, music and real life exploration. Activities included a "signs of spring" walk as well as the huge excitement of watching chicks hatch on the web cam before meeting them in person. One of the stories we enjoyed was the story of the "Little Red Hen" and we had great fun making our own bread. We have had lots of fun exploring eggs and playing games such as "Egg and Spoon Race" and "Splat the Egg"!

Thank you to Rowan class for hosting the incubator, eggs and chicks until their return to the farm this week. The culmination of this topic will be our trip to a real farm to see lambs and other baby animals along with Easter assemblies, Easter egg hunt and games. The pupils have each made wonderful progress in different areas and we are very proud of all of them this term. A fantastic term Willow, well done!















Pine Class

This term Pine class have been learning about animals, especially life cycles and where different animals come from around the world. In Literacy, we have focused on the stories 'Elmer' and 'The Zoo Vet' and the children have enjoyed role playing being vets and learning how to care for animals. We also had the fortunate opportunity to visit live chicks! We have really enjoyed seeing them hatch from their eggs and grow into little chicks! The children have been so confident with stroking and holding them. This term we have been to Taplow, enjoyed the beautiful sunshine and celebrated World Book Day when the children thoroughly enjoyed dressing up as their favourite characters. This term we have continued to make great progress in our independence skills and have had many opportunities to practise these across the school day. We are really looking forward to our topic next term 'Pirates - Land Ahoy!'. Well done Pine class for another fantastic term!









Rowan Class

This half term Rowan class have loved our spring topic, where we've been exploring baby animals and life cycles, such as that of a frog or butterfly. We have enjoyed the opportunity to host some chicks in the classroom, which involved handling, feeding and cleaning them out, demonstrating our responsibility and independence. We have been creating Story Maps in Literacy, using these to write our own versions of "The Ugly Duckling" and "Monkey Puzzle" and in Numeracy we have been working on division, 3D solids, shapes and data handling. We have also been taking part in Outdoor Learning; developing our basic first aid skills in PSHE and discussing the importance of personal space in RSE. It has been a busy but hugely rewarding term for all!

Aspen Class

This half term, our theme has been Ancient Egypt. We have focused on learning key facts and keywords relating to Egypt through different call and response stories: 'It's Miles to the Nile' and 'We're Sailing down the Nile'. We have had opportunities to go to sand where we were digging up Egyptian models and later on, we created sentences describing what we had found. In cooking, we have been focusing on independence and toasting skills, where we have made toast, potato waffles and crumpets. We have had lots of fun in PE where we have had the opportunity to use the trampoline and have worked on our core strength and balance. During Attention Autism Bucket, we have incorporated our money skills to pay for a turn during stage 3 and included special events for days such as Red Nose Day.









Cedar Class

This half term Cedar class have been learning about Ancient Egypt through a range of exciting ractivities.

We explored Egypt through a sensory story as we followed a journey down to the river Nile. We then got on a riverboat and read the story: 'Sailing down the Nile' stopping at different scenes such as an Egyptian market, a farm and the pyramids. We labelled pictures and wrote sentences to capture what we could see.

We all engaged in our Egyptian themed yoga sessions, which helped us to remember the new concepts. We enjoyed creating Egyptian themed art such as scarab beetles and the pharaoh's jewellery.

In our cooking sessions, we practised following instructions to make healthy snacks such as an Egyptian salad, vegetable muffins and banana and oat muffins. We have enjoyed our class picnics tasting the result of our work.

In Maths, we have been learning about the months and seasons of the year. We learned to read the analogue clock and matched the times to the routine of our day.

















Maple Class

Maple class have been working on their independence skills around making food and drink, and for some, it has also been an opportunity to try new tastes and textures! They have experienced making healthy snacks, which included Salata Baladi, an Egyptian salad. In Drama with Carla, the class did an' archaeological dig' in sand, during one of their lessons, as part of their learning about Ancient Egypt.

In Science, the class have been exploring magnets and what they attract and repel. We have now completed a term of swimming at Bulmershe, and all students have progressed well. In maths, the class were learning about terms around the topic of measures – longer, longest, shorter, shortest, taller and tallest etc.





Elm Class

It's been another busy half term in Elm Class!

In PSHE, we have been focusing on First Aid and what to do in an emergency. Everyone has really enjoyed learning about DR ABC, and practising moving someone into the recovery position.

We have been writing lists and using bullet points in Literacy, as well as learning all about Tutankhamen and his tomb! We also dressed up for World Book Day!

In Science, we have been learning about forces and enjoyed experiments that involved making boats and zip wires! In Art, we have been enjoying Egyptian themed activity stations and in Drama, we have been focusing on storytelling. We continue to enjoy our lessons in the secondary kitchen and celebrated Red Nose Day by making delicious jam tarts.

We have been making lots of progress in our swimming lessons each week! In PE, we have been trampolining and playing Boccia. Some of our class were invited to take part in a Boccia tournament at a local school. The Elm team were amazing and came 4th! Well done Elm!

We are really looking forward to a fantastic summer term! Our new topic will be Beachcombers!




Sixth Form News

Music Lessons


Early Years – This half term, the students have been going to a party. They have developed their rhythm and turn taking skills by 'knocking at the door' using woodblocks and taken part in party games like 'Pass the Parcel', 'Musical Statues', 'Charades' and 'Sleeping Lions'. These activities have given opportunities to explore new instruments, link movement and music together through starting and stopping and developing confidence to lead activities for others to copy.

Sensory and Complex Needs have continued on their hot air balloon ride around the world. They have been developing awareness of musical structure and rhythm through the 'Traffic Jam Song' before going to a sensory disco. They have also explored making and listening to ocean sounds





with rain sticks and ocean drums under the sea. KS2 and 3 – This half term, the students have continued exploring dances from around the world. Some have been learning clave rhythms and composing their own rhythms through salsa music, changing tempo with 'Hava Nagila' and reading rhythms and playing a Habanera bass line with the 'Tango'. They have been focussing on singing 'I Can't Dance' by Genesis and 'Dance Monkey' by Tones and I.





<u>Art</u>

Key Stage 3 have continued exploring print this half term. This half term we have experimented with mono printing, stencilling, rubbings and press printing. We have been combining different techniques and thinking about what work best for our ideas. I have been so pleased with how well all the students in Key Stage 3 have experimented with this topic this term and we have now got some very full sketchbooks!







Key Stage 4 Swan class and 6th Form Eagle Class have been learning how to use perspective and one point vanishing points in their drawings. We have been working with paint and having some fun with colour, looking at different landscapes and referencing the work of American artist Grant Haffner.



Kite Class have been working both collaboratively and individually to create pieces of art relating to colour. We have looked at the work of Piet Mondrian and his cubist primary colour paintings and we are now investigating Robert Delaunay's curves and use of secondary colours.





6th Form Art community group's sculpture is now on show in reception. The group made fish from used plastic bottles and created a plastic ridden seascape to raise awareness of the huge amounts of plastic that end up in the sea each year.



Immersive Theatre

This half term, students have been members of the public at the Rio De Janeiro Carnival. They are judging the dance competition and voting who will be the carnival's king or queen. They explore playing samba music, props which spin around and other props which float and rustle in the breeze. After making their choice using coloured paddles for the winner of the dance competition, they celebrate on the beach with a tropical drink.


FestForAll – Saturday 16th July

Dear Parents and Carers

I thought I'd use this Newsletter to update you on our recent AGM and to summarise the Trustee's report.

2021 was once again heavily impacted by Covid and the limitations that brought to opportunities to fundraise in a 'traditional' way. However, we have learnt from the experiences of 2020 and were more readily able to deal with some of the impacts.

There were a couple of new activities - we held our first virtual quiz night in May, the primary aim being to give our families an opportunity to have a little fun! It's always lovely to see the children saying hi to their friends via Zoom. There was a very special 'Addington round' which the children starred in.

In keeping with our aim of allowing people to support the Association (whilst being aware of everyone's time constraints), we launched the School Association lottery in May. The Association has received £1,698.30 from the lottery so far. This initiative, together with the 2 internet shopping sites (AmazonSmile and EasyFundraising) now provide the Association with a regular monthly/quarterly income stream.

In July, some of our 6th Formers ran a flower stall in Woodley Precinct in association with Eliza Jane flowers. All profits on the day were shared between the Addington School Association and the Ridgeline Trust. In total, the team raised an amazing £205.78 for the Association! In October the official opening of the new Early Years sensory playground took place. The Association had made the sensory playground the focus of its fundraising efforts for the last couple of years and were delighted to be able to donate £32,000 (approx. 50% of the funding) to the development. It was lovely to see the children enjoying the purpose-built environment. Lots of happy faces and fun being had! It was also brilliant to see the photos on the Wokingham Borough Council Facebook page.

Moving into December we held our annual Christmas Hamper Raffle and also the Christmas Fayre, these events raising £1,021 and £1,151 respectively. Whilst the Fayre was a little smaller than in previous years (due to some Covid restrictions) it was well attended, and visitors appreciated the opportunity to spend some time doing a little early Christmas shopping! Unfortunately, the ever-popular Carol Concert was cancelled at short notice given the concerns about the spread of Covid at that time. It was a huge disappointment, but the decision was taken with the best intentions to try and ensure everyone could enjoy the Christmas holiday.

This year marks the 50th Anniversary of Addington School's opening. It would be nice to be able to help the school celebrate this occasion and this subject will feature in our meetings moving forward. We hope to be able to run a number of events this year with Covid restrictions now being lifted. More info to follow!
