If your child has school dinners, and there is a balance outstanding on your account, we would be grateful if you would kindly clear this balance as soon as possible.

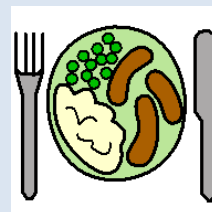
If you have any query or difficulty with payment of this amount, please let us know and we will endeavour to help.

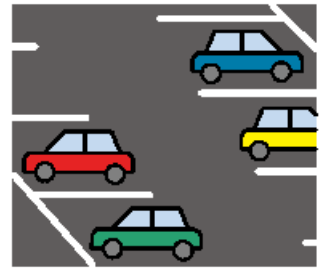

CAR PARKING REMINDER

Thank you to all parents who drop off and/or pick up their child from school for continuing to work with us to make our car park run as smoothly as possible. I have been actively monitoring the car park regularly over the last month and in general it is running smoothly. Below are reminders of key points to help maintain this.



To ensure the continued smooth and safe operation of the busy Addington car park we need all parents who drive their child to school to park in the Bulmershe Leisure Centre car park and walk across the zebra crossing, during drop off/pick up times. We have an agreement in place with Bulmershe Leisure Centre to allow this.

We do recognise that for a small minority of pupils crossing the road will not be possible. Therefore, a limited number of parent passes, allowing access to our car park, are distributed based on an individual's agreed needs; physical, emotional or behavioural.

If you feel you need a car park pass please let your class teacher know, including the reason for needing one. A member of SLT will then allocate a pass or contact you for further discussion/information.

We only have a small number of spaces for parents in our car park, so we will not always be able to give out passes to all parents who would like one.

Parents with Passes using the Addington School Car park

- Parents with passes must only park in the allocated bays near the main entrance and not in the main body of the car park where staff park, unless specific arrangements have been made with a member of the leadership team. This is especially important in the morning as some staff start at 9 and sometimes cannot find a parking space.
- Car park passes must be displayed clearly in the windscreen. The two disabled bays near the school are for priority wheelchair users and larger vehicles with tail lifts. Permitted drivers must use the one-way system marked out and only park in marked parent or disabled spaces.
- Unfortunately at busy times we do not have enough parking spaces onsite for all parents with passes. **Please work with our staff** as they manage these situations as efficiently as possible, this is likely to involve being asked to complete one or more circuits of the car park to ensure the car park flow is not disrupted.
- Parents can move the cones on the parent parking and disabled bays in the area near the main entrance, however if there is a cone with a sign on it, only move this if it has been allocated to you. Cones with signs on are to reserve spaces for a particular pupil with a specific need.

General instructions

- All pedestrians must use the zebra crossings and the pavement when walking around the school car park or to and from the site. **DO NOT WALK** on the road as a short cut. This is very dangerous and could result in an accident.
- Parents or carers must not park in the old entrance to Addington (near Bulmershe Leisure Centre) or on the double yellow lines near our old entrance, to drop off or pick up.
- **Please leave parking spaces promptly** - To support the process at the start and end of day to run smoothly, **please can I ask that all parents and carers vacate parking spaces in either of the car parks as soon as possible** to allow other parents access to the space. If you need to have a discussion with the teacher, please arrange a time to meet in person or have a telephone conversation to free up a parking space as soon as possible.

Early Years and Yoga

Bluebell Class

We have had a brilliant term in Bluebell Class! We went on two school trips, one to Taplow and one to Chobham farm. The children had lots of fun! Our topic for this term has been Transport, which has been a big hit in our class! In Communication, Language and Literacy we have been looking at 2 different books, *the bus is for us* and *Shabbat is coming*. We really enjoyed looking at the pictures of the vehicles and began to make the noises to match the vehicles. During cooking, we have made fruit rockets, banana split boats, and ice lollies to help keep us cool in the hot weather; the children continue to love cooking lessons! In Maths we have enjoyed exploring number through number songs - our favourite is now 5 little monkeys jumping on the bed! We have also learnt about capacity, shape, length and temperature. We are really enjoying our swimming lessons, with most of the children becoming confident to swim on their own! We love Music and Dance here in Bluebell, so our weekly Music lessons with Sean are always a lots of fun! The children have started signing/ singing along to the songs now! We are all so proud of how the children have settled into the routines of school. We hope you all have a lovely summer holiday and see you in September!



Daffodil Class

We have been working on learning about *Transport and Journeys* this half term! Our books this half term have been '*The Bus is for Us*' and '*The Train Ride*' which we have been doing using Call and Response to develop our listening and attention skills, alongside experiencing rhythm and rhyme. We have been working on taking turns to lead the call and response session using the drum and practising our sentence structure with regular Colourful Semantic sessions. Daffodil Class have enjoyed practising for our Proms performance which we performed on the stage for an audience: this was a great experience for us all and a wonderful time to showcase the great Music work we have been doing! Our work on *Journeys* has focused on different places we may visit during the summer holidays as well as learning ways we can keep ourselves safe in the hot weather, such as applying our own sun cream and making sure we drink lots of water to keep us healthy. We have enjoyed different activities this term, such as experiencing a Circus Skills workshop where we were eager to try the different equipment and showcasing our physical skills during Sports Day! More recently, we have been discussing which classes we will be in next academic year through social stories as the next part of our journey at school.



Daisy Class

This term Daisy class have been out and about! Through our sensory story, '*The Bus is for Us!*' and during immersive theatre sessions based on '*The Train Ride*' we explored the sounds and sensations of different types of transport and places. We touched bobbly bicycle tyres, ran our hands and fingers through soft shaving foam for clouds, scrunched straw and touched bristly brushes for the horse. Using the beautiful colourful parachute, we pretended we were riding in a hot air balloon being blown by the wind and we tried to stop the cheeky seagulls eating our chips at the beach! We absolutely loved our adventures in the school mini-buses. Who knew going over the speed bumps in the school car-park would be such a fun start to our day trips to the farm and adventure playground in Taplow. All of the Daisy children amazed us with their confidence in exploring different environments and new experiences. Back in school, we've been busy getting creative during Proms week and competing in Sports Day. What a brilliant end to an amazing year in Daisy class. Well done everyone and a huge thank you to our fantastic Daisy parents for your support.



Lily Class

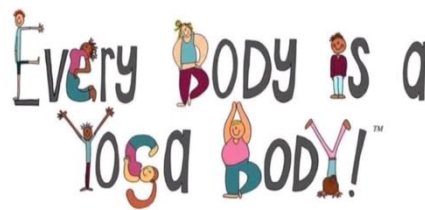
Tulip Class

The children are confident to cross safely at a zebra crossing and traffic light using our 4 key rules 'stop, look, listen, think'.

In Literacy, our key stories were called 'Freddie and the Fairy' and 'What the ladybird heard at the seaside'; the children enjoyed exploring this story through their senses and through role play. In Maths, the children have focused on Capacity, Time and Money as well as continual provision of Number and Amounts. The children have enjoyed lots of outdoor time, with water play this term, and they have put their Capacity skills to excellent use! Pine class have been an absolute pleasure to teach this year! They have made fantastic progress throughout the year and I wish them all the very best of luck for next year!



Willow Class

We have had an amazing last half of the Summer Term and are particularly proud of all the Willow pupils' achievements this term but also over the whole academic year. Through our topic 'Outdoor Summer Adventure' we have enjoyed many amazing and memorable experiences which have really promoted the pupils willingness to try new activities and develop their independence and life skills. From our days out at Odds Farm and Thames Valley Adventure Playground to boat trips on the Thames, plus a fantastic "Kids In Day" at school where we participated in circus skills workshops and watched a magic show, we have had a fantastic time. In maths we have focussed on money this half term and the pupils have really developed their understanding of the use of money and the value of different coins alongside other maths skills. Complex, Therapeutic and Sensory Needs Department

Apple Class

We have been practising our counting up to 5 using multisensory props and counting songs. We have been learning and recapping the sounds 'M' and 'S' during multisensory phonics by thinking about things that start with these sounds and exploring pictures, videos and objects that we might find in the classroom.

At the end of the term, the students have been busy performing and watching the Addington proms and participating in the sensory races. They walked or wheeled over bubble wrap, bubble machines, a sensory rope to pass under and a large parachute to go under.

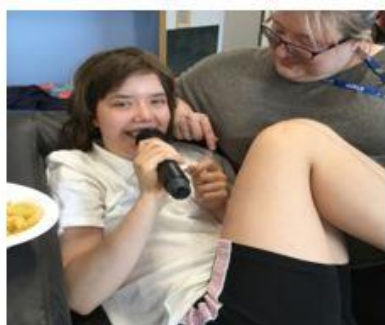
Access Department (Formally known as the Therapeutic Department)

We have had a busy term in the newly named Access department! The department name change has been due to a curriculum revamp and the introduction of Therapeutic Thinking Skills at Addington which is a whole school approach. Teachers have been busy developing a new curriculum for the department named *The Access to Learning curriculum*. The key learning areas of the curriculum include Regulation, Engagement, Communication, Literacy, Maths, and PSHE. Pupils are supported to learn strategies to support and develop self-regulation, engage within a broadening range of wellbeing and personal development activities, self-care routines, and adult directions and boundaries. Pupils will access Addington's Core curricular of Literacy, Maths, and PSHE when they have achieved appropriate levels of alertness and a sense of security. We have used the best and most current research in Sensory Integration, Therapeutic Thinking Skills, and Engagement to inform the pedagogy and strategies underpinning the curriculum. We are very proud of the provision we can offer the learners within our department and hope that you all enjoy reading about the progress your children have made within the new curriculum on Earwig. We have also expanded this term as Birch class have joined Holly, Lime, and Beech class to form the department. The Access department wishes all families an enjoyable summer.

Aaliyah: Swimming has been so fun this term. I loved doing Proms and cooking and going shopping. I can't wait for next year!

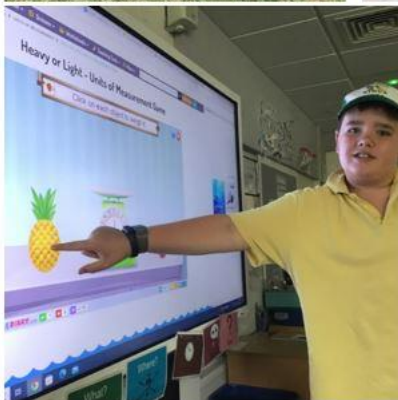


Maple Class

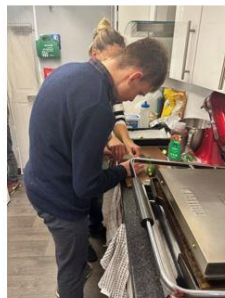
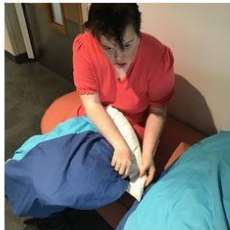
Eagle Class

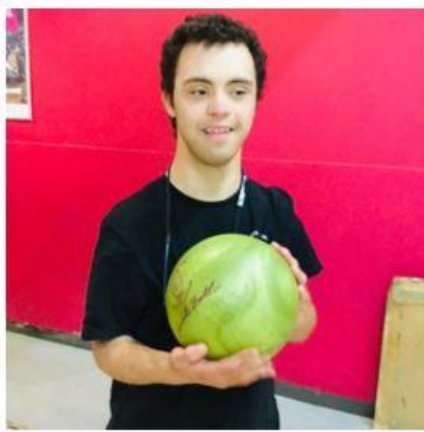




Robin Class

2022 – 23 Residential Trips

Residential trips are an integral part of our co-curricular activities at Addington. These outdoor educational trips afford our young people of varying abilities the opportunity to access adventurous activities and challenges, which give them, not only enriching experiences, but the opportunity to grow in self-confidence; and develop their social and independence skills. After a period of disappointments, this year we finally managed to reintroduce Residential trips for our students.

With the view to providing our students similar experiences, irrespective of ability, we have organised three residential trips this academic year.

In March this year some of our students in the Upper School went to PGL at Liddington, for five days and four nights. They enjoyed a very full programme of outdoor challenges, involving climbing, archery, canoeing, problem solving and team building activities to name a few. Later in the year, in May, some students from Key Stage 3, Year 9, also went to PGL Liddington and enjoyed similar enriching experiences.

In June 2023, some of our students with sensory and complex needs went to the Calvert Trust in Barnstaple, Exmoor where they experienced abseiling, archery, cycling, canoeing, crate stacking, horse riding and the giant swing. The evenings were more recreational, involving a visit from the local zoo and a disco.

Prior to these trips there is understandable trepidation all round, especially among parents of first timers. On our return it is clear that our young people have grown in self-confidence and independence, and developed their social and team building skills.

None of these trips would be possible without the dedication of the staff who give up their time to accompany and support our young people. Special mention needs to be made of Jo Oldreive, Jules Sharman, Kate Perkins, Sarah Parry, Jess Crehan, Gemma Toms, Lauren Willoughby, Bryn Watkinson, Gemma Baston, Cathy Sullivan, Emma Slade, Amelia Silvester, Beth Blaxall Jane Buckland, Emily Howell, Sue Harty, Dhanush Karan, Ian Brown, Nathanael Kent and Lou Duran, who went on one or more residential trips. A big thank you to Shelley Holland, Jackie Young and Ian Brown is also necessary for driving 386 miles to drop off and pick up the group that went to Calvert Trust.

To get some understanding of how beneficial Residential trips are for the wellbeing of not only our young people, but also their parents, some excerpts from parents' feedback about the trips are included.

- This was the first time our son was staying away from family and had been determined to go. Told us a lot about what he did and for him it has been a joyful and happy experience. The feedback he gave us indicated that the Residential had given him confidence on how to be more independent. If there is to be future residential trips there will be no hesitation from mum, who was nervous this time round, to send him next time.
- The residential trip to PGL offered our son a fantastic opportunity to try new activities and interact with new people. He has limited opportunities to do these things usually, so we are extremely grateful that he was able to participate on this trip. He seemed to have lots of fun and was able to talk about several of the activities he had enjoyed. The trip also offers an important opportunity for developing independence, alongside offering some much appreciated respite for parents and siblings. Thank you to all the staff who supported the students on the trip :)

- Our son thoroughly enjoyed his first residential with the School. He loved spending time with his friends and having sleepovers which he wouldn't normally get to do at home. As he has medical needs it was respite for my husband and I to not have to be doing his stoma care for a week.
- Looking forward to next one as it gives me quality time with other child and it also reminds me he is capable and I don't have to do everything for him so allow him to spread his wings and he survives.
- Our daughter absolutely loved the residential trip. I think her self-confidence has grown and she feels part of a group of friends with that experience as a bond.
- Our daughter, a wheelchair user and due to have spinal surgery, had a great time from what I could see and feedback from staff. We knew she was looking forward to going. We knew with the team of staff going that she would be in safe hands. It made leaving her with them easier for me without (so much) worry. As a result, I was able to enjoy a great week myself and recharge the batteries a little (though I missed my sidekick!) and gave her a real taste of grown up independence - something that doesn't come along all that easily or often for her.

I've just asked my daughter if she'd like to go again if she was able to and I got a very definite 'yes' in return! So fingers crossed it'll happen again!!

We served tea and cake at the Upcycled Auction this week and have had another super busy term in KORE café, keeping everyone going with sweet treats and fresh fruit smoothies!

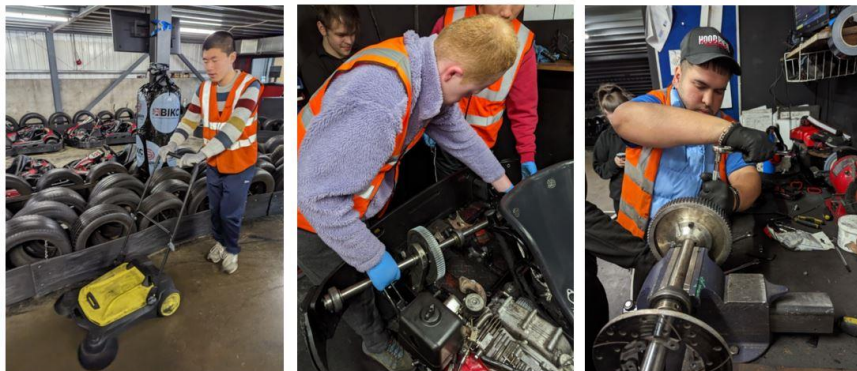


TeamSport Mechanics

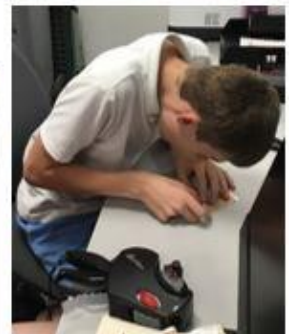

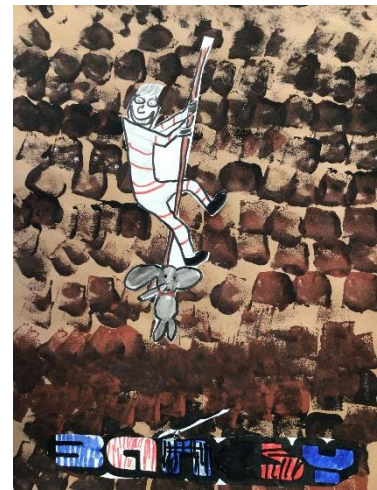

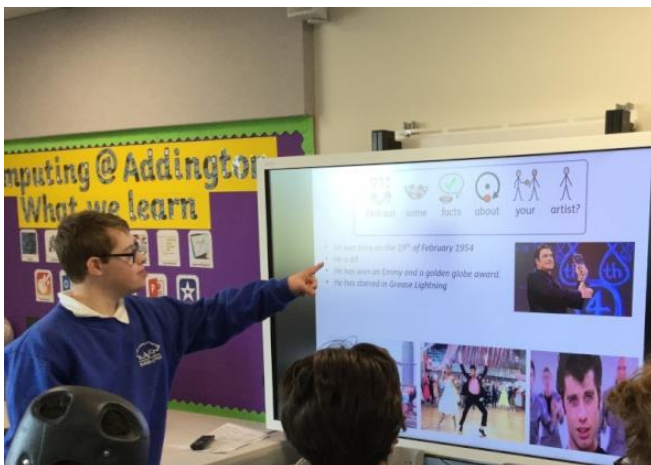
Art
