We have been supporting Joey and the team at the Addington Early Years Centre while they get familiar with the setting and what we have to offer. Joey has started supporting families at the Early Years Centre who are coming to the end of their first half term. Parents have been in to "stay and play" with their children and tour the new site when we opened, and have since been in to learn all about our curriculum.

Toni and Ellie have attended several appointments this half term with families, from hospital appointments, CAMHS appointments, college tours as well as home visits. Our role at such appointments is for reassurance, translating jargon if needed, to help take notes and to ask questions that you may feel embarrassed about asking.

A few weeks ago, we sent out a form to gather interest on the things that families might feel they need additional advice around - the results of this have helped us to create a schedule of events for the rest of this academic year.

We hope to get some more social events arranged as we understand how isolating it can feel at times trying to manage and juggle everything that comes with being a parent to a child with SEND.



CAR PARKING REMINDER

Thank you to all parents who drop off and/or pick up their child from school for continuing to work with us to make our car park run as smoothly as possible. I have been actively monitoring the car park regularly over the last month and in general it is running smoothly. Below are reminders of key points to help maintain this.



To ensure the continued smooth and safe operation of the busy Addington car park we need all parents who drive their child to school to park in the Bulmershe Leisure Centre car park and walk across the zebra crossing, during drop off/pick up times. We have an agreement in place with Bulmershe Leisure Centre to allow this our parents to park in their car park for 30 minutes during pick up and drop off times. The car park will be monitored by a leisure centre employed car parking attendant. We will work with the leisure centre to try and foster an empathetic and supportive approach to managing the car park to try and avoid any unnecessary distress for our parents.

We do recognise that for a small minority of pupils crossing the road will not be possible. Therefore, a limited number of parent passes, allowing access to our car park, are distributed based on an individual's agreed needs; physical, emotional or behavioural.

If you feel you need a car park pass please let your class teacher know, including the reason for needing one. A member of SLT will then allocate a pass or contact you for further discussion/information.

We only have a small number of spaces for parents in our car park, so we will not always be able to give out passes to all parents who would like one.

Parents with Passes using the Addington School Car Park

- Parents with passes must only park in the allocated bays near the main entrance and not in the main body
 of the car park where staff park, unless specific arrangements have been made with a member of the
 leadership team. This is especially important in the morning as some staff start at 9 and sometimes cannot
 find a parking space.
- Car park passes must be displayed clearly in the windscreen. The two disabled bays near the school are for
 priority wheelchair users and larger vehicles with tail lifts. Permitted drivers must use the one-way system
 marked out and only park in marked parent or disabled spaces.
- Unfortunately at busy times we do not have enough parking spaces onsite for all parents with passes.

 Please work with our staff as they manage these situations as efficiently as possible, this is likely to involve being asked to complete one or more circuits of the car park to ensure the car park flow is not disrupted.
- Parents can move the cones on the parent parking and disabled bays in the area near the main entrance, however if there is a cone with a sign on it, only move this if it has been allocated to you. Cones with signs on are to reserve spaces for a particular pupil with a specific need.

General instructions

- All pedestrians must use the zebra crossings and the pavement when walking around the school car park or to and from the site. DO NOT WALK on the road as a short cut. This is very dangerous and could result in an accident.
- Parents or carers must not park in the old entrance to Addington (near Bulmershe Leisure Centre) or on the double yellow lines near our old entrance, to drop off or pick up.
- Please leave parking spaces promptly To support the process at the start and end of day to run smoothly, please can I ask that all parents and carers vacate parking spaces in either of the car parks as soon as possible to allow other parents access to the space. If you need to have a discussion with the teacher, please arrange a time to meet in person or have a telephone conversation to free up a parking space as soon as possible.

Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year from everybody in Lily Class!


















Early Years Yoga with Rainbow Claire

We have enjoyed moving our bodies into a Christmas flow to decorate a tree and lots of relaxing music to our favourite Christmas songs too.



















Key Stage 2

Pine Class

Our Topic this term, was called 'Mountains and Snow' and the children enjoyed exploring mountains through yoga sessions and construction activities. In Literacy, we focused on the stories 'We're Going up a Mountain', which we explored through call and response, and 'One Snowy Night' which we explored through our senses. We also explored the story 'Stick Man' to help us get into the Christmas spirit! The children enjoyed making stick and leaf people. The children have been learning new signs through daily singing and signing sessions. In Maths, we explored Shape and Position; the children enjoyed learning Position through 'Cha Cha Slide'. In Cooking we have been making 'Brrrrr Smoothies' and the children have practiced chopping fruit and using a blender! In PSHE this term, we have focused on brushing teeth and washing hands through songs and role-play. Pine class have been very busy this term with a Diwali carousel, Explore Times and many Assemblies. We have been getting very excited for Christmas, enjoying lots of Christmas festivities such as a lovely visit from the reindeers, 'Jet' and 'Flash', a Snow White Panto and a last trip to Taplow! This term we have also celebrated Children in Need and participated in a Santa Dash, both raising money for fantastic charities. Willow Class

We have been having lots of fun learning with our new topic, "Mountains and Snow" and we've had the right weather for it with our recent frosty mornings! There has been lots to celebrate this autumn with Fireworks night, Diwali and the upcoming Christmas festivities. We've participated in creative Children in Need activities and a Diwali carousel, making delicious edible treats and diva lamps out of clay. We even had Mehndi patterns drawn on our hands. The children really enjoyed leanring about Diwali with a sensory approach. The chidlren have explored 3D art with Angie this term and created some magnificent pieces. Everyone loves cooking in Willow class but the eating is the most enjoyable part (hence why you haven't seen much of it come home!) We have made peppermint creams and decorated biscuits. We were excited to bake for the gingerbread interhouse competition and we made snowmen! Our maths focus has been on using a numberline to recognise numbers in order and using it to count on and back for addition and subtraction. The children were taught to jump like a frog forward and back and found this analogy very helpful. The children were really inspired by our stories this term and have practised the skill of signing and acting out stories as they become more familiar. We are very proud of their storytelling. With the change in temperature we often see a rise in bugs so we have made our PSHE focus about washing our hands correctly and using a tissue to "catch it, bin it, kill it." The children enjoyed seeing how quickly germs (glitter) are transferred and how hard they are to wash off! We look forward to welcoming you into school for our Parents Stay and Play session where you will see a lot of of creations on the walls.




















Oak Class

Tommy: I like telling silly stories and doing Aroma Touch with Jane.


Daisy: I loved swimming this term at Bulmershe, and Drama club too!

Some students have been to the driving range as part of Life Long Leisure. They have shown off their skills hitting the golf ball a considerable distance. They have supported each other to improve on their technique.










We have spent time in the community where students have been working on shopping for a list of items and using self-service checkouts.

News from the Workshop

What another busy term!!

We have been beavering away just like Santa and his workshop with all of his hardworking elves. The students have risen to the occasion and enjoyed making all sorts of new products that will be on sale at the Christmas Fayre and also completing lots of ground work to a few new projects that will be launching in the New Year.

They have been making baking themed decorations including whisks, rolling pins and cookie cutters transforming them into stunning tree decorations. We have also been making some amazing scrunchies and Christmas cards.





This half term, specialist subjects lessons have continued across the department and many of our students have been attending offsite events, especially during the festive period.

Music

ΕY

Early Years have continued with Weather songs, focussing on Thunder and Snow. They have explored simple rhythms and song structures using a big bass drum and cymbal, making different sounds using the resonance board and exploring glockenspiel playing.

<u>Sensory</u>

This half term in sensory music we have been continuing our journey across North America, this time with a focus on the music of the American Frontier. We started our session with a welcome song based on the iconic melody from 'The Good, The Bad and The Ugly', with pupils responding through vocalisation, movement, or exploring various instruments in keeping with the theme of the piece. We then explored tempo change through the 'William Tell Overture', using words associated with horse riding to change our tempo e.g. trotting, galloping. The pupils cued tempo



changes and joined in exploring drums. We explored further vocalisation and interaction with theme song from the classic TV show 'Rawhide', before settling down by the campfire and exploring various wooden instruments to 'The Campfire Song'. When December arrived, we pivoted into our Christmas lessons, going on a journey to the North Pole.

KS2

This half-term in KS2 music, we have continued to learn about music through the topic of 'Way out West'. For most KS2 classes, our focus has been on composition. We used a storyboard to help us compose a soundscape focusing on emotion and feelings, deciding whether our music should sound happy/sad, loud/quiet, fast/slow to match the story. We rehearsed our compositions and performed them to the group. We then pivoted to focus on Christmas carol singing, rehearsing our carols for various off-site and on-site concerts.



KS3

This half-term in KS3 music, we have continued to learn about music through the topic of 'Way out West'. Our focus has been on exploring various instruments found in a pop/rock band, learning to play bass guitar, guitar, keyboard and drum kit parts from 'Sweet Home Alabama', before putting together a class performance of the song. We then pivoted to focus on Christmas carol singing, rehearsing our carols for various off-site and onsite concerts.

KS4

Kite class have been working towards a skill share which is a part of their Bronze Arts Award. They learnt 'Ho Hey' by 'The Lumineers' on ukulele, drums and xylophone before picking which instrument part they wanted to teach to someone else. They had to plan what equipment was needed and develop social skills to show somebody what to do. First, they taught some teachers, then shared their skills with 3 classes in KS3. They all did a fantastic job and reflected upon the project too.

KS5

Kestrel class have been participating in a leadership project as part of their Silver Arts Award. The project was about creating films which showcased local arts centres. The students planed their project collaboratively and were designated different leadership roles within the group for each film. They went to venues like Reading Museum and Everyman Theatre in Wokingham to film the venues and interview staff who worked there. The films have started to be edited by Kestrel class too.

Art

Key Stage 2

Willow and Rowan class have been exploring Art through the topic of 'Snow and Mountains'. We have experimented with a range of materials, creating a variety of 2D and 3D landscapes. We have modelled 3D figures using pipe cleaners, made clay snowmen and penguins and used paint to print and paint different landscapes.







Key Stage 3

Aspen and Beech class used the Hogwarts of Coats of Arms to create their own shield designs. They have chosen their own colours, patterns and creatures to represent their personalities.





Elm and Chestnut class have continued to create artwork based on figurative shapes, this term they have incorporated lots of colour theory. We have referenced the work of Keith Haring to create paintings using Primary, Secondary and Complimentary colours. They have also made 3D wire figure sculptures.







Key Stage 4

Key Stage 4 have continued work on their Bronze Arts Award. This term they have concentrated on sharing a skill. They have been exploring different ways of making hanging decorations using clay. They then chose their favourite design and showed Chestnut class how to make one too! We have a lovely morning working together, creating beautiful decorations.







6th Form

Eagle Class have been exploring lots of different materials and techniques over this term, experimenting with clay, wire, painting and print.





Drama

Early Years

Theme: Christmas

Daffodil, Lily and Bluebell have had a visit from the Christmas Elf. Classes have enjoyed engaging with the cheeky elf and looking at what is in her Christmas sack. We have played with the parachute catching snowballs and watched our teachers becomes cheeky Elves and fall on the song when singing our 5 Little Elves Song.

KS3 Drama

Theme: Magic

Students have been developing performance skills whilst at Magic School. They have transported to the land of magic and been learning and practising how to become a wizard or witch. Students showcased a short magic show.



Theme: Storytelling

Falcon class have been on the drama rotation this half term



Falcon class discussed topical news stories and create a still image showing the event. We then explored how we could bring the still image to live using key drama conventions-narration, thought tracking and physical theatre.

Falcon class used the stimulus of the gaming world to create a short individual performance based around the real world and being an avatar character in their chosen game. Students worked on developing control with performance skills. They also showcase their work to Swan class and did a skill share, showing their game control commands and movements.





<u>KS5</u>

Theme: Storytelling- focusing on KS5 project theme 'Right here, right now'

Robin class enjoyed taking part in drama social games developing eye contact, voice and social interactions. Robin class participated in some sensory drama evoking all of the 8 senses. Our first experience was visiting the local park where we met some interesting characters. A duck who was hungry, a dog that kept doing poos and an old man who lost his wallet.

We also looked at local stories and visited Huntley and Palmers Biscuit Factory and explored different rooms in the factory before receiving a final treat of a tasty biscuit!





Immersive Theatre

Theme: The Circus

This term we have been at the Circus. Students have been developing sensory awareness through experiencing a wide range of sensory props, storytelling, music and sound. We explore the 8 senses through our sessions.

Vision- we have watched a Tightrope walker shadow screen.

Hearing - music from the 1920's- Ragtime

Smell - smelling the hay bales (cedar wood oil) sweets (candy cane sweet oil)

Taste - eating candyfloss

Touch - touching pom poms, weighted beanbags, candyfloss, the clown's suitcase.

Vestibular – throwing beanbags into a target

Proprioception - experiencing being on a ride- vibration and spinning

Interoception - notice and acknowledge students reactions how they might be feeling.















Clubs

This half term Addington Band started to work towards the Addington Association Christmas Carol Concert. They have been learning 3 pieces and had to make a tough decision to leave one out. Carla has been running a drama club who have been playing lots of Christmas themed drama games and Martin has been hosting the Xylophone and Percussion Club who have been learning 'Winter Wonderland'



The Magic of Music and Yoga with Claire and Karen









Our magic of music and yoga sessions run by Claire, (yoga teacher) and Karen, (music therapist) have been going well for Poppy and Cherry classes. We start by singing hello to each student in turn, then have time for experiencing different textures of scarves whilst singing our favourite rainbow song. Following this is yogic breathing and ohms led by Claire, and we've experienced that along with sound bowls, Hoberman spheres and special lights for our Diwali celebrations. Next we each choose an instrument and improvise using these and vocal sounds whilst Karen sings or plays the clarinet, and we play along to some

favourite songs too. The sessions then slow with a calm, reflective time as we use soft brushes on our hands, feet and faces whilst listening to some relaxing music, before it's time for the goodbye song. Each student has time for themselves whilst also being aware of the others in the group.







Photography Project

This term Jules has have been working with students from Year 9 on their iPad Photography Project. Students have really enjoyed using the iPads to practise their photography skills. They have been mindful of perspective – looking up, down, through and between, and turning the iPad for landscape or portrait shots.

To date, 07/12/2023, our average whole school attendance for this term is 91.96% - which is fantastic and above average in comparison to other Special Schools.

While our aim, for most pupils and those without complex medical needs, is 95% or above, we understand that our pupils face challenges and have additional barriers in their way when it comes to attendance – this is where I can try to help.

My role is to help families overcome these barriers, where possible, whether it is school refusal, transport issues or something else in the way. I work with staff and the local Education Welfare Officer to come up with strategies and plans to get our children attending school as much as they can.

I have recently added a <u>page to the school's website for attendance</u> including a section on "Is my child too ill for school?" Please have a read.

Please remember if your child is going to be off or late for any reason, contact the school on each day of their absence either via calling and leaving a message or sending an email. Not hearing why a child hasn't attended will be followed up by phone calls and/or a home visit to check everyone is ok.
