WORK RELATED LEARNING

National Grid

The Interns

We have reached that time of year again when the students move on to new placements, or adopt new roles in existing placements. The feed-back we have received from teams working with our students has been very positive, and the interns thoroughly enjoyed show-casing their success during the 'End of Placement' celebration. We are also delighted to report that work on a data-base completed by one of our interns is being used for a case-study as a model of good practice for another national company. This is a tremendous achievement and it really does show that once our young people enter the world of work, they continue to push their boundaries and rise to new challenges.

Outside of their placements, the interns are engaged in their career pathways with the job coaches and outside agencies. Having completed vocational profiling in partnership with the Supported Employment Service, the interns have completed very detailed and informative Curriculum Vitae. They have received advice and guidance centred on their career directions and realistic future aspirations as they enter the final phase of their internship.

Team Building Event

This term, the FE students have worked hard to facilitate three team building events at Addington School for the National Grid staff and leadership team. Working with Chris Jones from the Horticulture team, the students identified areas in the school that required updating and refurbishment. Using their experience of safe practice and the use of PPE, the students had to help staff plan for the provision of correct safety equipment, tools, as well as wet weather and dry weather jobs.

Over three days, the National Grid teams worked hard to re-paint fences, sand and re-varnish equipment in the wobbly path, sand and paint play equipment, power-wash play- yards and dig flower-beds. One team even managed to begin work on the plastic bottle green-house at the allotment. Throughout the school, it was wonderful to see students not only admiring the freshly painted equipment, but also chatting with and introducing themselves to the various teams. The tremendous effort on the part of the National Grid has been very much appreciated and we are delighted to have had follow-up requests for similar events in the future!







Hospitality

The FE 'City and Guilds' Hospitality students have continued to experience an increasing demand for their produce at Shuter's café in Wokingham Borough Council. In addition to their café enterprise, the young entrepreneurs have facilitated several lunches for outside employers. The National Grid held three team building days at Addington School, and this provided an excellent opportunity for Hospitality students to show-case their skills by preparing and serving all their coffee breaks, and a fresh lunch each day. The leadership team at National Grid was particularly impressed by the high quality standards in both presentation, service and food standards. Growing in confidence with the feed-back received, the Hospitality young entrepreneurs are looking forward to hosting at a staff inset day next term.







Horticulture

The weather has slightly improved and the students have been working at the allotment, preparing the beds and painting the work shed. Work has begun on the plastic bottle greenhouse and, hopefully, will be completed in the next two weeks. We have volunteers from the National Grid working alongside some of our City & Guilds horticulture students constructing the frame, which is very interesting to watch! At the front of the school the City and Guilds students have been preparing and painting the benches to complete one of their accredited Units of assessment. Having left clear WET PAINT signs, the students were shocked to find that people could not wait to sit on the newly refurbished benches....they may have had to refurbish their clothes afterwards though!

We have hundreds of plugs to pot on and hanging baskets to plant up so we are going to be really busy over the next term. Once we have done this there will be very little room left in the greenhouse! The tomato plants have really grown in the past week and the students have had to pot them on for the third time. We are looking forward to summer tomato salads from our own

school garden!







Work Experience

Job Safari

This half-term began with one of the most exciting events in the careers calendar....Job Safari Day! It was a very successful day, with input from a range of employers who provided 'hands on' interactive activities for students at every level from year 9 upwards. The employers were very impressed by the enthusiasm and input from students, as well as the students and staff levels of enthusiasm.



This term we have also been preparing for Pre-16 work experiences. It has been wonderful to see students arrive into school wearing smart clothes in preparation for their interviews. We look forward to students beginning their week block placements in local businesses such as Brown Bag café and Zappa's hairdressers.

Extended work placements are also continuing for students in Years 12 - 14. They have been receiving on-going visits from staff in school and from the Central Berkshire Education and Business Partnership. It is lovely to be able to report back on the positive feed-back from employers as students continue to grow in confidence and develop skills relevant to the work-place.

Work Ready Days

A group of KS4 students have completed a four week 'Money Management' programme facilitated by staff from Metro Bank in Reading. The programme has aimed to teach students about the difference between essentials and non-essential items when trying to manage a savings plan, budgeting, bank accounts and reading bank statements. The final day of the programme involved a trip to the Metro Bank where students were able to find out more about how money and finance is managed on a day-to-day basis in the bank. Learning more about the use and management of money is excellent motivation for our students to work towards paid employment in the future.

Students who won the 'Oracle Design Challenge' from Job Safari Day were treated to a 'behind the scenes' work ready day at the Oracle. The winning team not only got to view their winning model proudly set-up, displayed and labelled in the main office building but they were treated to a tour from the services manager. Students had opportunities to view the recycling facilities at the Oracle, a guided 'birds eye' view of the current building works and access to the control room where security cameras fed in live images of CCTV throughout the grounds. The tour ended with a series of interactive workshops provided by employees and managers from The Apple Store. This was a very successful work ready day, and a wonderful opportunity for students to learn more about the services industry investigate careers in the security and services business and find out more about managing retail premises.

These 'work ready days' also provide valuable opportunities for our students to develop their 'soft skills' that employers have identified as desirable skills from employees. These include meeting new people, asking relevant questions, positive body language, use of polite greetings, appropriate dress and following social cues in formal situations.





Buddies

The Buddies have been working hard to support and mentor other students in the play-grounds at break and lunchtimes. This term we have also welcomed two buddies from a neighbouring school into our training programme. All Buddies have been continuing with work-shops in school to develop their mentoring and leadership skills, as well as re-visiting positive friendships and staying safe with others.
