Within two weeks, with the guidance of their instructor Karen Seymour and her team, they have planned, baked and catered for six different events in the school calendar, including a Rotary Club lunch, a celebration at Wokingham Town Hall at which John Redwood MP was in attendance, as well as school functions. What is even more wonderful is the fact that the entrepreneurs have now placed a fee on their services!

It is really fantastic that our young people recognise the value of their work-skills, both in terms of their own personal and professional development as well as helping them to gain paid employment. Well done to all of them, and they truly deserve a restful summer!

**Horticulture** 

We are delighted with achievements and success this term; two students achieved their City and Guilds Level 1 Certificate in Horticulture and another student has graduated with a City & Guilds Level 1 Diploma in Horticulture.

It was great to be able to handle some beautiful slow worms that were found in a half empty compost bag at the allotment. We brought them into school to show everyone then we put them back safely in the ground.

Students have harvested a few kilos of onions and our final job this term is to harvest the lavender, before it goes too dry, and store it ready to make Christmas gifts. The tubs at the front of the school have grown considerably since the students first planted them and have been admired by lots of people. We now have staging in the plastic bottle greenhouse and the students have planted peppers in large pots with a wicking system for irrigation – next will be the pumpkins!

The students have done very well to work so much in the hot weather this term, drinking gallons of water and pacing themselves! Well done to all the students who have worked hard this year in Horticulture, and we look forward to growing more great things from September!

# National Grid - EmployAbility

## The Interns

The Interns in the Employability supported internship programme have succeeded in completing their one year internship working at the National Grid! This is a fantastic achievement, and the interns should feel very proud of their achievements. Each intern has been on a very personal journey that has taken them out of their 'comfort zone,' given them new and exciting opportunities as well as broadened their horizons in terms of what they can achieve in life.

We are delighted that each of the one of the interns has carved out their own individual paths following the programme, based on what they feel is right for them and their progress over the past year. One of the interns has accepted a full-time permanent position of employment at a Level 2 job within National Grid.

Whilst one student has accepted a paid apprenticeship at Ikea, another intern secured one of only fifty nationwide positions in a tapered internship supported by Royal Mencap. Two of the students have decided to move on to college, with a focus on progressing to Level 1 courses. It really has been the most exciting year for the interns, and we are looking forward to tracking their successes in the future!

### **New Intake**

This year, three young people have been successful in gaining a place on the 2017-18 EmployAbility supported internship at National Grid. The young people have completed 'taster' days within their new placements, and have met their managers at National Grid. During the summer holidays these young people will be following a travel training programme, supported by the Wokingham Supported Employment Service at Optalis. We wish the good luck, and are looking forward to sharing their successes in the new academic year.
