**Dear Parents and Carers,**

We have come to the end of another busy half term which has been a hive of activity across all parts of the school. The importance of curriculum enrichment for our pupils cannot be understated as it is the key to engagement, motivation and enjoyment of school. Our PE and Creative Arts department, along with Department Heads, have organised many enrichment activities this term from guitar, brass and drum concerts, wheelchair rugby, Polybat competitions, football tournaments, a Bamboozle Theatre visit and many more as you will see from the following pages.

## IMPORTANT NOTICE

### CHANGE TO END OF SUMMER TERM DATES FOR PUPILS

**School will close for pupils on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> July instead of Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> July.**

Due to the opening of the new FE building in September, many classrooms in the main school need to be moved before September. Alongside this we have been notified that all rendering to the outside of the building is defective and needs to be removed and replaced. This could involve removing windows and is a lengthy building project that is too high risk to undertake whilst pupils are on site. In order to facilitate these two major projects, the school will be closed to pupils on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> July. Wokingham Local Authority has given permission for this closure. I apologise for any inconvenience caused but the safety of pupils is paramount.

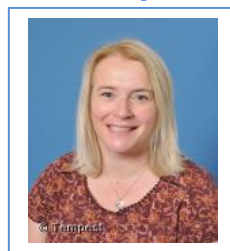

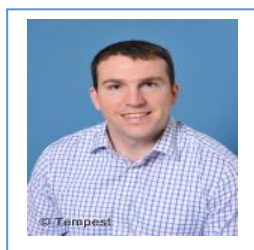

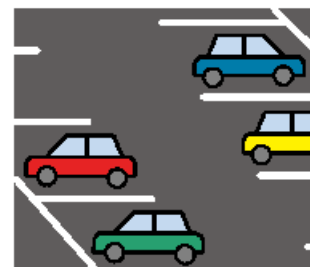

## School Dinners

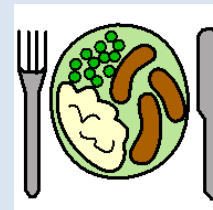
This is to inform you that all school lunches must now be paid for online. The school will no longer be able to collect cash on a daily basis.

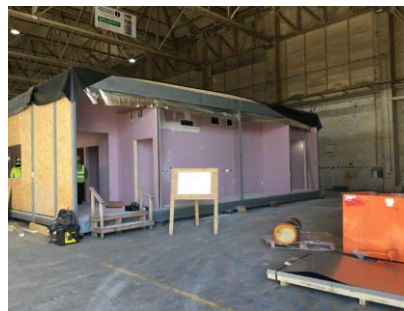
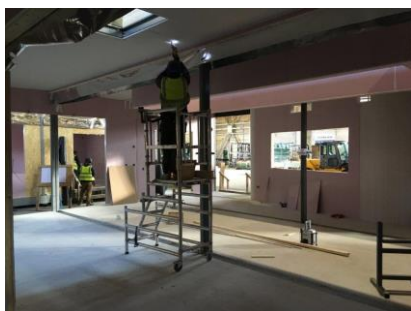
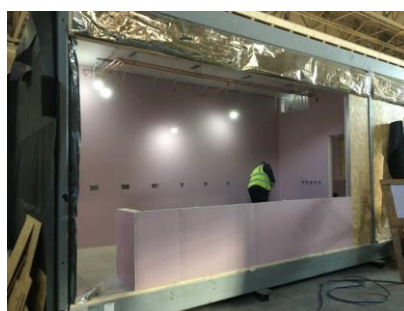

## Early Years

### Daisy Class



We have really enjoyed 'The Gingerbread Man' sensory story with puppets, scented dough, tasting, sensory trays, cooking and also counted buttons onto the gingerbread man.

Daisy class have particularly loved continuing with a new theme for Immersive Theatre titled: 'The Lost Crown of India', there are monkeys to entertain us, food to cook around the camp fire and fireflies to watch!



We have also introduced early phonics with the class using a balance of multi-sensory techniques incorporating letter recognition, a song, mark making in a sensory tray as well as touch and feel of phonic resources.

### Sunflower Class

This term Sunflower Class have welcomed 2 new pupils into our class. The other students have been keen to get to know them and it has been lovely to see them settle so well in to our early years group.



Our theme this term has been 'Traditional Tales and Puppets' and we have explored the following books: 'The 3 Little Pigs', 'Goldilocks and the 3 Bears' and 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. Pupils have participated in many activities linking to these books, and particularly enjoyed creating puppets, making houses and re-enacting the stories. The favourite activity of many of the pupils seemed to be our 'Very Hungry Caterpillar' sensory story as they had the

opportunity to taste and explore different food items and tell the story using props.



We have also begun to deliver sensory phonics with the class group. Many of the children have been curious and have enjoyed getting involved in these sessions.

### Chestnut Class

Chestnut Class have been learning about the festival of Mardi Gras. Mardi Gras translates as Fat Tuesday. This is celebrated in February on the same day that we celebrate Pancake day in countries including America, Brazil and Italy. Some countries have a festival that lasts a whole month. They have parades where they dress up in amazing costumes and they wear amazing masks.





The idea is that they have all of this fun and eat up all of the delicious food before a period of 40 days and 40 nights of fasting or eating plainer food to reflect the 40 days and 40 nights that Jesus spent in the wilderness before he was crucified.

There are three important colours that feature in most Mardi Gras costumes and masks. Purple which represents Justice, Green which represents Faith and Yellow which represents Power.

Each class in KS3 have learned about Mardi Gras and have made masks or costumes. After Half Term we will have a joint Mardi Gras Celebration where they will all wear the masks they've made and we may even have a parade with music and dancing around the school!



### Maple Class

Maple class enjoyed a trip to Woodley shops to hunt for Alison's lost teddy. We had to follow clues and write down the names of the shops we visited. We looked in lots of shop windows for teddy, but finally found him in Greggs! We then practised our money skills by buying a drink and a snack. On the way back we practised our social sight words by reading lots of signs and our maths skills by reading door numbers. We had a visit from the Fire Service, the students put on their equipment and had a go using the fire hose!



KS3 Get Together activity this week was making a mini town in different groups! 'Mayor Tom' arrived to cut the ribbon and formally open Addingtown! There were some great buildings made in next to no time – a factory, a block of flats and houses.





## Cherry Class

## Beech Class



This half term Beech class have been thinking about where we live and our local area and we had a look at our houses on google street view. We have also been working on independence and life skills with Gail. We have learnt to fold clothes properly and Hoover. The school cleaners have been very impressed! Next, we are going to learn to iron and polish so hopefully the class can help more at home too!

Sycamore class enjoy going offsite to practice money skills and social skills in the community. We have been buying ingredients for our cooking lessons: our most recent bake was jam tarts.

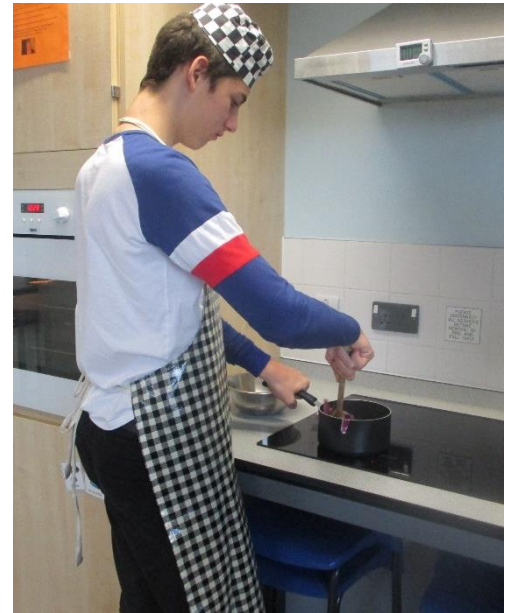

Indoors they have sowed tomatoes, leeks, kale, sweetcorn, turnips, onions and garlic. Our potatoes are chitting.

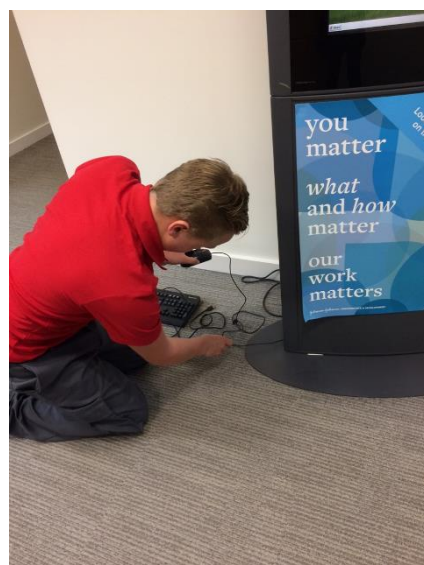
Because some of the seeds are so tiny we have been making seed tapes to place directly in drills, which means the seeds are evenly spaced and can be sown really easily.

## Work Experience

**The Birches – Reception** - Students have been spending time working with the residents on reception, taking deliveries, signing people in and ensuring the communal areas are tidy. This has been great for our students to showcase their social skills they have developed.

**Wokingham Library** - Tasks in the library include ensuring the books are in alphabetical order, in the correct number sequence using their dewey-decimal system. We also work hard to ensure the books are tidy and not damaged.

**Rainbow Café** - It has been a busy few weeks for the café with lots of events going on. Students were responsible for laying tables, ensuring meal orders were taken, delivering drinks and food to the tables. It has been great to see our students blossom into this role.

**The Birches Café** - We have been working with the kitchen staff to assist residents with their lunch time meals. This would mean, helping lay the tables, helping the residents to carry their food to their tables, clearing away plates when they are finished.





**Loddon School** - We have had the pleasure of being able to use the Outside Classroom that has recently been built for the students at Loddon School. The Work experience is split into animal care – grooming the horses and donkeys, ensuring they have a clean place to sleep and the horticulture – working with the school's horticulture therapist to plant, sow and grow!



**Sainsburys** - In Sainsbury's we work alongside Sainsbury's staff to ensure enough produce is out on the shelves, removing any empty cardboard containers and ensuring the shelving bays are tidy. The students enjoy this task.

We also spend some time in the clothing department, sorting the clothing into the correct sizes and in the correct places.



**Waitrose** - The students who are at Waitrose in Woodley work independently alongside a member of Waitrose staff. They are taught the Waitrose method that is employed by all staff. They will check the food sell by dates and arrange shelves.

**Café Piazza** - We have been working with the café for a long time now and have been able to introduce a mentorship programme for students who have had previous work experience here. This has worked well to help induct new students to work experiences, learning from each other.



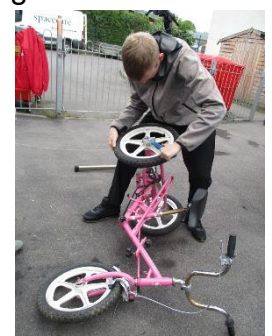
**Marks and Spencer** - Students have been working in the menswear department, ensuring clothing items on the rails are 'pipped' with the correct size – this is a great problem solving task. It is also the students' responsibility to greet the customers when they enter the changing room and be there for help

**The Co-op** - Students have been working independently at The Co-op. It has been great to see them blossom and integrate so well within the staffing team. Once they have completed their task, they approach the manager for more work. All the staff within the store have been extremely pleased with the progress being made.



**Hair of the Dog** - This work experience is always our more practical one, It has been great to see the student travelling independently to and from their placement and working hard to ensure his work is done to a high standard. They have also spent some time with the owner who is teaching them about all the different dog breeds.

**Bike Maintenance** - We have several students who attend Bike Maintenance based in school, run by an outside agency. It is great to see the progress being made. They have now been given a new storage shed and soon we will be looking to approaching the public for any bike repair needs.



## Swan Class Spring Term

Our project this term is Fast Fashion. Our class has a challenge to create an outfit for each student using clothes we have bought in charity shops. We have been scouring the shops in Woodley to look for suitable items



## Fast Fashion - the environmental impact of fashion

Did you know that the fashion is the second largest polluter in the world? Every year 100's of tonnes of clothing goes to landfill which could have been reused or recycled. We have been sorting pre-loved clothes to sell at a pop up shop in Woodley precinct next term, on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> March. Perhaps we will see you there?

We had a great time trying some of the clothes on!

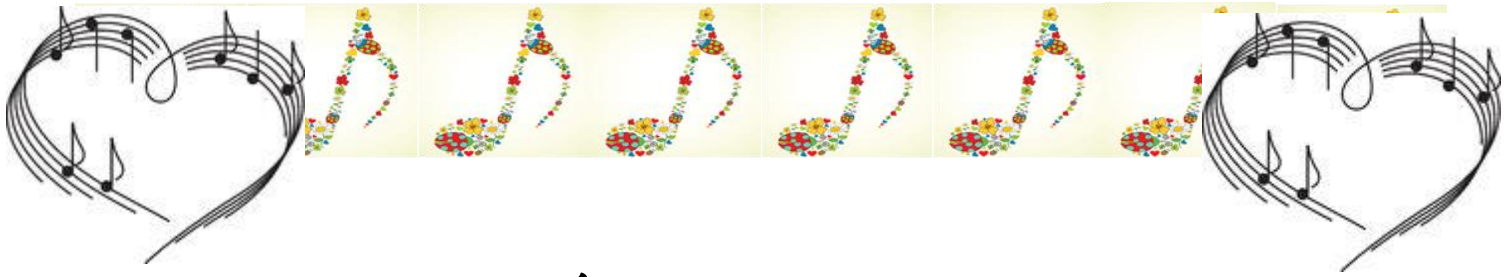


## Independence Skills – Café and shopping

Additionally, we do our supermarket shop each week, finding the ingredients, asking questions and then paying a buying the ingredients for cooking our two-course lunch on a Tuesday.







# The Creative Arts Page

It has been another fantastic and enthusiastic start to the term with new themes in our curriculum and concerts taking place.

## Music

We have several themes running in music lessons this term. Key Stage 3, 4, and 5 have the theme of 'Fast Fashion' and have enjoyed exploring guitars and drums to play 'Dedicated Follower of Fashion.' Key stage 2 and complex needs classes have been exploring music about the jungle and our Early years' classes have been exploring 'Around the Isles', where they sing and play music about a journey around the British Isles and meet all sort of characters.

Throughout the year we give opportunities for students who are having instrumental lessons to share some of their work with their friends in our Addington Music Series. This half term we have enjoyed concerts from our brass, guitar and drum students. Students enjoyed sharing their music with friends and it was great to see how their skills and confidence have continued to grow.



## Art

Our art teacher Angie has been working with upper school classes this term as they explore their topic of 'Fast Fashion'. Students have been creating outfits using recycled materials. We are looking forward to the Fashion Show later in the term.

## Drama

This term some of our complex and sensory needs classes have been taking part in Immersive Theatre Sessions. The sessions are based upon camping in the jungle and combine music, art and drama.

Our drama teacher Chris has been working with classes in Key Stage 2 as they prepare for their production of The Earth Crown later in the term.



## Workshops

We enjoyed a visit from Bamboozle Theatre Company this term, with their immersive production of Makara and the mountain dragon! We are feeling very inspired by their amazing props and hope to use some ideas for our own productions.
