


<u>Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award</u> 2019-2020

Early Years

Daisy Class



In Daisy Class, we have really enjoyed exploring our weather theme through stories such as "Elmer's Weather" and "Mrs Moppet's Washing Line" as well as sensory poems. We have used sensory umbrellas to tell the stories and enjoyed exploring different weather conditions through sensory activities and listening to the rain outside, under umbrellas. We have also explored different sensory massage stories. The last couple of weeks we have been in full Christmas swing, busy with paints and glitter to make Christmas stars and cards. We have loved exploring the lights and sensory materials associated with Christmas, creating snow scenes and exploring with our senses. We enjoyed our visit from the Christmas Elves last week spreading Christmas cheer.







Sunflower Class



This term in Sunflower Class we have enjoyed learning about different weather through our stories. We really enjoyed "We're Going on a Bear Hunt" - experiencing different weathers through our sensory stories and even having a go at dressing up like a bear! We have all had a go at dressing up this term too - using our dressing up box in the classroom and dressing up for our Nativity in the classroom. It was a great way to learn about the Christmas story and the children really liked their costumes! We have explored different foods and textures during our messy play sessions and continued to enjoy cooking once a week. We have made a whole range of things from chocolate covered apples to gingerbread men. Over the last few weeks we have had lots of Christmas fun, enjoying a visit from Elves, singing Christmas songs and decorating the class Christmas tree.











Tulip Class



In Tulip Class this term, we have been learning and exploring different types of Weather! 






Yoga and Music and Movement with Claire







It's great to see the student's enthusiasm for reception and the role and responsibility of being the 'receptionist' is taken seriously.



The students have immersing themselves in creative activities throughout the festive period and been busy creating lots of Christmas decorations which have been filling up the corridors around Addington for all to enjoy.








Addington Carol Concert
