
CAR PARKING REMINDER

Leisure Centre Car Park

This can be used by parents for dropping off and collecting children.

School Car Park

To ensure the smooth and safe operation of the busy Addington car park we need all parents that drive their child to school, to park in the Bulmershe Leisure Centre car park and walk across the zebra crossing, during drop off/pick up




We only have a small number of spaces for parents in our car park, so we will not always be able to give out passes to all parents that would like one.

Parents must only park in the allocated bays near the main entrance and not in the main body of the car park where staff park, unless specific arrangements have been made with a member of the leadership team. This is especially important in the morning as some staff start at 9 and sometimes cannot find a parking space.

Car park passes must be displayed clearly in the windscreen. The two disabled bays near the school are for priority wheelchair users and larger vehicles with tail lifts. Permitted drivers must use the one-way system marked out and only park in marked parent or disabled spaces.

All pedestrians must use the zebra crossings and the pavement when walking around the school car park or to and from the site. DO NOT WALK on the road as a short cut. This is very dangerous and could result in an accident.

Parents or carers must not park in the old entrance to Addington (near Bulmershe Leisure Centre) or on the double yellow lines near our old entrance, to drop off or pick up.

Daisy Class

In our music sessions and Make Sense theatre, we tried different instruments, listening to more stories, sang and danced. In our Christmas story, Dear Santa, we thought about big and small presents, quiet and noisy presents and explored different messy textures. Then, we spent our time using different materials, techniques and loads of glitter to make some special presents for our families. We hope you love them!

















Primrose Class



In food play we have been exploring around the world foods. The last couple of weeks, we have been getting into the Christmas spirit and have begun celebrating in lots of festivities. The children thoroughly enjoyed seeing the reindeers, decorating gingerbread men, making Christmas arts and crafts as well as attending our Christmas assemblies.





















Sunflower Class



This term we have loved exploring our topic of Around the World and Christmas, through different sensory trays of animal habitats from around the world and having the opportunity to explore different foods from different countries. We especially enjoyed tasting Yorkshire puddings! 




Key Stage 2 Newsletter

Oak Class

We have been learning about lots of exciting things as part of our topic "Starry Night" this half term with a particular focus on space! We have made our own paper mache planets and learned about our planet Earth and where we live. Oak class have been learning curling skills and dance moves in PE and completed maths investigations with temperature and measure in the sensory garden. We have been planting bulbs in Outdoor Learning and are looking forward to watching the flowers grow later next year. The children have all really enjoyed their swimming sessions and are gaining confidence quickly. We have been writing a lot in Oak class, with a focus on sounding words out phonetically and letter formation..... we are so proud of our writing! We have all mastered the art of making a sandwich and using a knife carefully to spread and cut. Some children were extremely adventurous and tried 3 different fillings at once! More recently we have been getting ready for Christmas and making lots of arts and crafts gifts to share with our families at home. We hope you like them!



Pine Class

Pine class have had a fantastic term! Our topic this term was called 'Starry Night'; we focused on two key stories called 'The Night the Stars Went Out' and 'This is the Bear and the Scary Night'. The children have enjoyed learning about space and pretending to visit the moon on our rocket ship. The children were able to make lists of key items they would take to the moon, mostly food! In Maths, we have focused on Capacity, Length and Weight; the children especially enjoyed measuring capacity with hot chocolate! In Maths, we have also been discussing the temperature, learning new vocabulary such as 'freezing' and what we need to keep warm.

Within our RE curriculum, Key Stage 2 took part in a Diwali Carousel, learning all about the festival of lights and enjoying a Diwali cuisine.

This term we also celebrated Children in Need and took part in some Pudsey activities, all dressed up in our favourite Pudsey outfits.

We were also very lucky to have another trip to Taplow! This was an exceptionally cold visit, so the children enjoyed participating within the indoor Christmas activities and soft play! 


Lime class


Kite Class
















Kestrel Class

We also had a very interesting meeting arranged by a member of the Control Room team where the students learnt how and why the National Grid works and where the work the students do fits in. We were lucky enough to be able to go into the Control Room itself and 'helped' one of the engineers 'buy' electricity to cover gaps in the demand. The students all enjoyed the visit.





We rounded off this term with having the Addington Students sing festive songs at National Grid which was enjoyed by all NG staff and we were happy to meet up with some ex-Addington students who now work full time for National Grid.

TeamSport Mechanics

This half term some of our sixth form students have been accessing their level 1 mechanics course at TeamSport Go-Karting track in Reading.


They have been learning about MOT tests and pre-delivery checks after completing the Health and Safety module.

In practical sessions they have learnt to check and adjust tyre pressures using an air compressor, as well as checking oil, screen wash, brake fluid and coolant levels. They have also had to perform interior and exterior checks on seatbelts, dashboard functions, lights and body work.

Students have also been testing that the karts are working properly by driving test laps and they have all successfully completed an entire circuit since learning to drive up and down the ramps.







Work Experience – External Placements

We have had a busy term for external work experience placements. We have been working in Decathlon, Co-op, Superdrug, Loddon School and many more! 28 students have been placed this term with over 4 weeks' work experience each. These placements are a providing valuable insight into the world of work and helping the students to gain new skills, experience work life and develop and engage with new skills.

Work Ready Days

Owl Class enjoyed a work ready at Pizza Express in Bracknell. They learnt lots of new skills such as how to stretch the pizza dough into the correct shape, why they use pizza ovens, how pizza dough is made and the types of tasks the employees have to complete on a daily basis. The students got the chance to play chef and create their own pizzas from scratch!











The Creative Arts Page

This half term, specialist subjects lessons have continued across the department and many of our students have been attending offsite events, especially during the festive period.

Music

Early Years have been exploring the theme Autumn and Bonfire Night. They developed their awareness of changing between two rhythms using the gathering during our Halloween song. Students explored playing a variety of wooden percussion instruments including a large xylophone. During the festive period, there are been a focus changing playing styles using a glockenspiel and developing anticipation and interactions skills through musical cues.

In Sensory and Complex Needs music lessons, we have continued with our journey through Tolkien's Middle-Earth, this time retelling the story of The Lord of the Rings. We started in The Shire, celebrating Bilbo Baggins's birthday with a song about fireworks, focusing on vocalising 'oooohs' and 'aaaahs'.





We then travelled through a forest, exploring wooden instruments, with pupils using a switch to signal for us to 'STOP!!!' if they saw a monster. After several other exciting musical activities, we ended our journey in Mordor, with our huge gathering drum. The pupils absolutely loved this journey; and all this before we moved onto our festive journey in December.

In KS2 lessons, we have continued with our theme of 'Journeys', starting off with turning last half term's song 'Slow Train Coming' into a full band piece, learning about the different parts that make up a

band including bass, rhythm, harmony and melody parts, then putting it together as a class band. We also explored tempo and dynamic changes through Rossini's 'William Tell Overture', first through body percussion, then through drumming and by taking it in turns to lead the group with tempo and dynamic changes. In the latter part of the half term, we learnt some simple rhythm notation with the song 'Mango Walk', before beginning some seasonal singing.





KS3 classes have been focussing on developing ensemble skills playing chords and the bass line to 'Fly Away' by Lenny Kravitz. Students have also explored learning the chromatic melody of 'In the Hall of the Mountain King'.



KS4 students have been focussing on learning the melody to 'William Tell'. They used rhythm grids to learn the rhythm of the melody and then worked towards playing each phrase until they could play the whole melody. Students have spent some of their lessons learning about different art forms and the different jobs in the arts sector. They used to talk about what they like and are good at in the arts.

In 6th Form, the community group have been learning to play the ukulele. They have been focussing on learning two chords and exploring how to change between them. They have also focussed on developing ensemble skills, choosing their role in the band and developing their independence to set up and rehearse their parts on their instrument of choice.

Art

In Key Stage 3 we have continued developing our drawing and painting skills. Sycamore, Chestnut and Elm class have been creating imaginary portraits of Kings and Queens. Aspen and Maple class have produced a range of pictures using a variety of different mark making techniques.







In Key Stage 4 we have been creating stop motion animation! Students have created their own characters, sets and directed short stories.





Out lunchtime clubs have started as well. Carla has been running a drama club, Martin has started the Xylophone and Percussion Club and Sean has started a choir. Claire has been running an EY music club throughout the week and a Yoga club for Poppy and Cherry class.

Reading Junior Music Festival

In November, 4 of our KS2 and KS3 students performed in the Reading Junior Music Festival at The Hexagon which involved primary schools from the Reading and Wokingham area. Our fabulous choir have been rehearsing since September and have attended mass rehearsals at Earley St. Peter's School and at The Hexagon. They were brilliant, singing and signing and were the stars of the show. They did themselves, their families and the school proud in our first concert in a long time.

This half term, our 6th form students have been planning an art exhibition at the school which displayed artwork from across the whole school. They worked in groups to plan and complete jobs needed for the exhibition. 
