CAR PARKING REMINDER


Leisure Centre Car Park

This can be used by parents for dropping off and collecting children.

School Car Park

To ensure the smooth and safe operation of the busy Addington car park we need all parents that drive their child to school, to park in the Bulmershe Leisure Centre car park and walk across the zebra crossing, during drop off/pick up

times. However, we recognise that for a small minority of pupils this will not be possible. A limited number of parent passes, allowing access to our car park are distributed based on an individual's agreed needs; physical, emotional or behavioural.




Parents must only park in the allocated bays near the main entrance and not in the main body of the car park where staff park, unless specific arrangements have been made with a member of the leadership team. This is especially important in the morning as some staff start at 9 and sometimes cannot find a parking space.

Car park passes must be displayed clearly in the windscreen. The two disabled bays near the school are for priority wheelchair users and larger vehicles with tail lifts. Permitted drivers must use the one-way system marked out and only park in marked parent or disabled spaces.

All pedestrians must use the zebra crossings and the pavement when walking around the school car park or to and from the site. DO NOT WALK on the road as a short cut. This is very dangerous and could result in an accident.

Parents or carers must not park in the old entrance to Addington (near Bulmershe Leisure Centre) or on the double yellow lines near our old entrance, to drop off or pick up.













Abbey Sports Leaders at Addington

On two Tuesdays this half-term, students working towards their Sports Leaders qualification from The Abbey Girls School in Reading, provided basketball sessions for our after school sports club pupils. Early Years and Yoga

Bluebell Class

We have had a lovely term in Bluebell Class! Our topic for this term has been *Weather*. In Communication, Language and Literacy we have been looking at 3 different books; *Kipper's Book of Weather, We're going on a leaf hunt*, and to celebrate Easter we looked at *We're going on an egg hunt*. We really enjoyed listening and watching videos of the different types of weathers. We were very lucky to experience some snow this term! During cooking, we have made soda bread jam sandwiches (to celebrate St Patrick's Day), Easter nests, pancakes (to celebrate Pancake Day) and making a Rainbow out of fruit: the children continue to love cooking lessons! In Maths we have enjoyed exploring number through number songs - our favourite is still '5 little ducks'! We have also started learning about capacity, weight, money and shape. We are really enjoying our swimming lessons, with a few children becoming confident to swim on their own! We love Music and Dance here in Bluebell, so our weekly Music lessons with Sean are always a HUGE hit! We have started our Yoga lessons with Claire this term. The children love the relaxation and sensory sessions. We are all so proud of how the children have continued to settle into the routines of school. We are very excited for our next topic... Animals!













Daffodil Class

Our topic this half term has been *Weather and spring*. We have enjoyed experiencing different weathers through regular outdoor learning opportunities; we especially enjoyed the snow! We have worked on using weather related vocabulary during Attention Autism Bucket and Literacy activities to extend our use and understanding of vocabulary. We have enjoyed learning about different celebrations, including Holi and Mother's Day.

We have enjoyed two trips to Thames Valley Adventure Playground where we have been working on our play skills, through sharing and turn taking, developing our self-occupying skills by choosing our own activities and developing our physical skills in Soft Play and the wider outdoor environment.













Daisy Class

This term Daisy class have been exploring the weather using all of our senses with our sensory story, 'Kipper's Book of Weather'. We started with rain, listening to the sound of water pouring over an enormous umbrella; pitter, patter, drip, splash! We squashed and squeezed sponges to create watery rainy paintings. Then we created beautiful round shining suns using dripping runny glue to stick shades of yellow and orange collage materials. Using percussion instruments, we created sound effects for the rain and sunshine. To help us with our weather story we've loved exploring the vibrations on the resonance board as we all hammered and tapped out rain and thunder storms. Everyone smiled at the sensation of whooshing, swooshing air as we played with the rainbow coloured parachute and we got messy shaking and flicking paintbrushes to create rainbow-inspired art. We were so happy when, right on cue it snowed! The snow was fluffy, sticky but brrr... so cold!



Primrose Class

This term in Primrose class our topic has been 'Weather, spring and Easter'. We have enjoyed exploring different types of weather through the story Kipper's Weather, such as rain, snow and rainbows! We have enjoyed exploring different mark making techniques such as stamping with sponges, drawing with pens and chalks as well using paint dabbers. We have also experienced various sensory trays with ice, cotton balls, water and heat packs.

This term we have been lucky enough to visit Thames Valley Adventure Playground in Taplow. We all had a wonderful time and can't wait to go back again!

We have also been having sessions to Forest School on Mondays. We have had a wonderful time climbing trees, exploring the area, going on bug hunts and playing parachute games with leaves and sticks.

Primrose class really enjoyed the Story telling week and loved our sensory story of Room on the Broom! We enjoyed the various noises, puppets and experiences that the week gave us.












Sunflower Class

This term we have really enjoyed getting out and about on some trips offsite, travelling on the minibus and then the coach to Thames Valley Adventure Playground and then on the minibus to Sol Joel Park. For most of our pupils this was their first time travelling on a bus but they managed this really well and loved being able to explore a new place! Our topic this term has been Weather, spring and Easter and we've enjoyed exploring pancakes whilst learning about pancake day, experiencing different weather through our sensory stories and joining in with lots of fun Easter activities such as an Easter egg hunt! Swimming lessons have also been a highlight for us this term and all the pupils have become so much more confident in the water with lots of them now swimming without adult support and to the deep end! The pupils have continued to make brilliant progress with their communication skills this term as well - we're so proud of them all!



Tulip Class

This term we have been a busy exploring different types of weather and learning about spring. We have enjoyed sharing sensory stories *Kippers weather and Elmer's weather*. We also enjoyed a Holi dance learning about the festival of Holi and had fun exploring spatter art and matching colours. We have also been looking at night and day linking it to Ramadan. In art we have been exploring mark making with different tools and painting with colours. We have really enjoyed the spring themed attention bucket sessions this term. We have been exploring vocabulary linked to movement and using choosing boards to explore new movements in soft play.

In PE sessions we have been doing apparatus circuits and Rebound on the trampoline, which the children have really enjoyed. Pre-sensory circuits is going well, with the children showing more independence following adults modelling to engage in more of the equipment. The highlight of the term was the trips to Taplow, exploring new environments and extending our play opportunities. The children have also been enjoying engaging in functional play through role play, for example, picnics looking after babies and supermarkets.

We have also been working on using communication boards in play experiences to request specific toys and learning how to wait and take their turns using visual support. Some have been developing their symbolic play skills by pretending to make trains out of the furniture and resources in the classroom. In maths we have revisited capacity and weight, exploring the vocabulary 'full, empty, half full and heavier and lighter'. Through cooking we have continued to explore maths concepts and use communication boards to make choices of ingredients. We have been exploring and comparing the size of objects using vocabulary 'big and little as well exploring big and small Easter eggs with hidden chicks with our Easter themed activity.' We have continued to focus on our numbers to 20, recognising, ordering and one to one correspondence. We have enjoyed our number based Easter egg hunts too.

























Lily Class

We've had another very busy term in Lily class. Our topic this term has been *all about the weather* and each week we have explored a different type of weather in our learning activities. In literacy, we have enjoyed reading the story *Elmer's Weather* and engaging in a sensory story with different props. In maths, we have been practising counting to 20 and engaging in Waldon sequencing activities. We have enjoyed attention bucket and art activities, linking to the different types of weather. We particularly enjoyed the rain and snow! As part of our PSHE, we have explored appropriate clothing for different types of weather, including when it's sunny and when it's cold and rainy. We have also had lots of fun celebrating events such as Pancake day, World Book Day, Red Nose Day and Easter! Happy Easter everybody!























Marvellous March Yoga in Early Years with Rainbow Claire

This term has been full of **Marvellous Yoga and Mindfulness** as we enter spring with exploring lots of wonderful breathing techniques and new yoga poses across the Early Years classes. We have enjoyed the *weather* yoga cards linking to our themed topic and completed the flow below. Give it a go over the Easter holidays.

We have enjoyed the sound healing benefits of the somanic drum and wind chime to help with relaxation and regulation as well as the continued benefits of 'Relaxation' at the end of every yoga session (step 6 of our Mini Me Yoga programme) with calming music, blankets, mindful toys and sensory lights. The intention here is for every child to be fully present in the moment and experience a sense of stillness; calm for their body and mind.

Key Stage 2 Newsletter

Oak Class

We have been continuing to learn lots of exciting things as part of our topic "*Dragons and Castles*" this half term! The children enjoyed the story of "*Zog*" and we had a visit from a drama company during Book Week where we explored the characters and their antics through games. We all had fun dressing up and sharing favourite stories during Book Week.

With the onset of spring, the children have enjoyed observing the changes in our sensory garden in Outdoor Learning sessions. The bulbs that we planted have started to grow and it is becoming very colourful outside. We have enjoyed getting our hands dirty and making faces out of all things natural.













In maths we have been learning to order 2D and 3D shapes from our "shape shop" by describing what it looks like instead of saying its name. We have learnt how to use the words; straight, curved, edges and sides. We have also explored positional language and making different amounts of money using whole pounds.

Our term isn't over yet and we have an exciting trip ahead of us.....Look out Windsor! We're on our way!

Pine Class

Pine class have thoroughly enjoyed continuing with our *Dragons and Castles* topic this term. In Literacy, we focused on new stories called 'The Paperbag Princess and 'We're Going on a Dragon Hunt', the children enjoyed exploring these stories through call and response and through their senses. In maths, we have focused on key topics such as Money, Shape and Positional Language. The children are becoming confident in exchanging money for items through our snack cafe. Next term, we are hoping for trips to the shops to put this learning into practice.

This term we have also celebrated World Book Day, I am so proud of all the children and their excellent costumes - good effort Pine class! We have also celebrated Pancake Day, Red Nose Day, St Patricks Day, Mother's Day and Easter! In literacy, we have also focused on the stories

'The Odd Egg' and 'The Five Little Bunnies' alongside lots of Easter Activities. The children have continued to work hard on understanding their emotions and the emotions of others.

Pine class also enjoyed another trip to Taplow where we continued to build relationships with our peers. We are all looking forward to our trip to Windsor Castle at the end of term to finish off our Dragons and Castles topic. Well done Pine Class for an excellent Spring Term! Willow Class

Willow Class have found this topic 'Castle and Dragons' extremely motivating and have had so much fun learning more about the lives of people who lived in a castle and particularly enjoyed roleplaying the actions of a knight. We have explored castle buildings and characters through stories, art, music and real life exploration. One of the stories we enjoyed was the story of 'The Paper Bag Princess' and we loved chanting the story as a Call and Response and adding actions. We also enjoyed reading 'George and the Dragon' and thought of some great adjectives to describe the dragon. The culmination of this topic was our trip Windsor Castle where we could experience everything we had been learning about in the classroom, unfortunately we didn't get to meet the King!

We have also been doing lots of 'real-life' learning in maths and developing our understanding of money and capacity as well as practising our addition and subtraction skills.

For the last two weeks we have begun to think about 'Easter' and enjoyed the story of 'The Odd Egg' and we have had lots of fun exploring eggs and playing games such as 'Egg and Spoon Race' and 'Splat the Egg'! We enjoyed an end of term Easter assembly, Easter egg hunts and games.














The pupils have each made wonderful progress in different areas and we are very proud of them all. A fantastic term Willow, well done!

Rowan Class

This half term we have been continuing with our *Dragons and Castles* topic, which has been hugely motivating! We designed and created products such as dragon sock puppets, shiny knight helmets and explored the features of old castles in greater detail. In literacy we shared topic-related stories such as *The Princess and the Dragon* and *Zog and the Flying Doctors*, where we focused on the rhyming patterns and the impact they have on the reader. We explored the topics of money, shape (both 2-D flats and 3-D solids) and position in numeracy, using and applying our growing skills in a range of practical and real life contexts. We created simple circuits in science, using batteries to power lights and buzzers. We continued talking about puberty and body changes in RSE, both external and internal, with activities including using dolls to explore the concept of public and private. We discussed the benefits of a healthy lifestyle in PSHE, including looking at the *Eatwell Plate* and completing some daily exercises during Healthy Lifestyles Week. We finished the half term by sharing the Easter Story and completing a series of Easter-themed games and crafts, including during a KS2 Easter carousel. It has been a busy but fun half term and the pupils have all more than earned a little break. Well done Rowan class!


Apple Class



Weekly visits to Camp Mohawk were run as sensory and therapeutic sessions.

Weekly City and Guilds in Horticulture has continued, as well as visits to The Ridgeline Trust by some students, to learn about and have a sensory experience in gardening.

With our project title being 'What a Load of Rubbish' our young people have been focussing on the principle of 'waste not, want not'. They have been caring for the environment by recycling and reusing items. They have enjoyed DIY activities, using a variety of tools. During these sessions they learn about the importance of identifying hazards, Health and Safety in the work place, and team work.

Travel and town training, and staying safe in the community has been practised. The highlight of this half term has been a residential trip which most of the class went on and thoroughly enjoyed.

After an eventful half term, a well-deserved break is looked forward to when, once again, everyone can recharge their batteries in readiness for another even busier term ahead. Eagle class wishes all a very happy Easter, and a safe and enjoyable break.

We have continued to visit cafes in town, concentrating on ordering clearly, and have had a brilliant time trampolining in PE to improve our core strength and leg muscles as well as our balance and coordination. This term in Hospitality the students have been busy as ever keeping the café stocked up with lots of freshly baked cakes and opening up to staff and students 3 days of the week.












Work Experience




It has been a great half term in the Creative Arts department with lots of fun and engaging learning taking place in lessons.

Music Lessons

Early Years have continued exploring space songs. They have been learning different playing techniques using the glockenspiels, exploring new metallic instruments to create

a space soundscape and singing 'Mr Golden Sun' using Makaton signs to support.









Key Stage 2, 3 and 4

have also been continuing to explore jazz. Students have been focussing on improvising, understanding the concept and using a blues and pentatonic scale to improvise on xylophones along to 'So What' by Miles Davis, 'Sweet Home Chicago' and 'Oh When the Saints'. Some students have learnt a 12 bar blues bass line and then played it in different keys to play more songs.

In the 6th form, the community

group visited South Hill Park Arts Centre. They had a tour around the centre and learnt what activities and facilities are available there. They have continued focus on developing ensemble skills and developing their independence to set up and rehearse their parts on their instrument of choice.



Art Lessons

Key Stage 3 classes have been developing the skills they learnt making their collage artwork last half. Using cutting, pasting and layering techniques, we have been working in 3D to create 'Art in a Box' (Dioramas). Working in pairs, students have been creating imaginary planet landscapes using a range of materials, such as cardboard, fabrics, pipe cleaners and plasticine. We have looked at the work of Diorama specialist Allison May Kiphuth to inspire our ideas!



In Key Stage 4, our Stop Motion animations are now complete and will go on the website by the end of term if you'd like to take a look!

We are now thinking of making canvases for the specialist classrooms as we have been enjoying making them so much!




Drama Lessons


